→ What is violence?

Violence at home happens between partners.
It is also called: **Domestic Violence**.

For example:

Between husband and wife.

Between boyfriend and girlfriend.

Within the family.



Sometimes domestic violence happens
when partners separate.

Then, for example, the ex-husband is the perpetrator.

This violence often happens in the home. But also,
in the corridor or on the street. In cases of domestic
violence, women are almost always the victims.

Most of the time men are the perpetrators
of domestic violence.



→ How does violence happen?

Women experience different types of violence.

Physical violence:

When someone hits or kicks a woman.

When someone injures a woman with fire or other things.



Sexual violence:

When someone forces a woman to have sex.

When someone touches a woman even though she does not want it.



Psychological violence:

When someone threatens or verbally abuses a woman.

When someone imprisons a woman.

When a woman is not allowed to have friends.

When a woman is not allowed to work or go out.

Different types of violence often happen together.

This is especially bad for women.





→ **What are the consequences of violence?**

Many women become ill from violence.

Some are very sad.

For a long time.

Other women have trouble sleeping.

Some women feel guilty.

Or they often have severe fear.

Some women hurt themselves.

They injure themselves.

Or they try to kill themselves.

Many women experience violence from their partner over a long period.

Only after years do they seek help from another person.

Or at a counseling center.

Often women experience violence for a long time before they seek help.

This is a severe consequence:

Many women are killed by their partner.

→ Who helps in the event of violence?

**If your partner threatens you,
call the police.
Emergency call: 110.**



State the following on the phone:
Your name and address.
Say you need help.
Say if you are injured.
Say if there are children or other people
in the home with you.
Say if the perpetrator is still there.
And if he has a weapon.


Get yourself and the children to safety until
the police arrive.

The police can make
the perpetrator leave.
For the time being, he is not
allowed to come into the home.




→ The Violence Protection Act


If you need protection for a longer period, the **Violence Protection Act** can help you.



The law states:
For example:

The perpetrator is not allowed to enter your home.
You can live alone in the shared home.
The perpetrator is not allowed to come near you.
He is not allowed to write letters to you.
He is not allowed to email you.
He is not allowed to call you





**To do this, you must
file an application with the family court.
So that the perpetrator can no longer threaten you.**

Most of the time the process goes very quickly.
The application for protection against violence is often
valid on the same day.
Then you will be safe on the same day.

Sometimes it gets difficult.
For example, if you and the perpetrator have children.
Then the father is allowed to see the children.
Get help from a legal advocate to keep you
safe anyway.

→ **How does the Women's Counseling Center help?**

You can get information at the Women's Counseling Center:

What can you do about the violence?

What are your rights?

Where can you find good attorneys on violence?

No woman must deal with this alone.

You can get help from counseling centers



For example:

You can go to a women's counseling center near you.

A consultant will help you.

You can consider options together:

What can you do about the violence?

Where are you safe from the violence?

You may need a place in the women's shelter.

What can you do about the perpetrator?

For example, report him to the police.

→ **How does a women's shelter help?**

If a woman experiences domestic violence, she can go to a women's shelter.

She is protected in a women's shelter.

The women's children are also protected.

At a women's shelter, women who experience violence can get help.

You can live there.

You can get advice.

You can get information.

The female employees at the women's shelter support the women.

They brainstorm together:

How can a woman's life go on?

What must happen so that the woman can live without violence?

How can the woman and children be protected?

The female employees in the women's shelter can advise and support the women.

They know what can be done to help women live well again.

For example, they advise on how the women can get money.

They advise women on their rights.

They accompany women to agencies.

Or to court.

The female employees in the women's shelter also help the children.

If the children witness violence, they may have problems when they grow up.

The female employees support the children.

So that they can be healthy and self-confident later.

Many women live in the women's shelter.

They help each other.

For example, they cook and eat together.

Sometimes they celebrate together.
